T.A.G.S. Funding

(Technology, Arts, Gardens, Science)

REP's T.A.G.S Program is a non-competitive program, with funds allocated to every school in the district. Proposals within the allocated amount have been submitted by your principal.

Please remember, a minimum of 45% of your school's allocation must be spent on the Arts. A maximum of \$500 may be spent on gardens and the remaining monies may be spent on the arts, sciences, or technology. Enjoy your projects this year!!

REP is at work to help you provide innovative programs and enrichment opportunities for students. This year, we are pleased to be able to give out over \$120,000 to schools and teachers in RUSD. Almost \$70,000 in funding is allocated to all schools, based on ADA. Up to \$60,000 will be awarded to winning grants written by teachers. This year, we are increasing the cap per grant to \$4,000. Please see the accompanying articles for more information and deadlines. We are committed to supporting you so that you can enrich the lives of students in our schools.
