Artwork Submission Guidelines

The 2020 Student Notecard Collection will be created from elementary student artwork. We are once again looking for great works of art!

DIRECTIONS & PROCEDURES

- **Submit artwork** along with a completed Release Form for each entry. The current 2020 Release Form may be copied or found on REP's website at <http://www.rep4schools.com>.
- **Deliver entries** to the District Office (20 W. Lugonia) c/o REP, attn.: Tish Velazquez.
- Artwork should be appropriate for reproducing into notecards and, for marketing purposes, be attractive to the consumer.

DEADLINE for all artwork entries:
Wednesday, April 8, 2020 at 4:00 p.m.

ARTWORK GUIDELINES

- Art entries must be created during the current school year.
- Artwork may be in the medium of the artist's choice: charcoal, pen & ink, crayon, pastels, acrylics, oil, watercolors, collage, paper, clay, etc.
- Art must be submitted on one dimensional paper. Please submit a photograph if medium is a sculpture, multi-media collage, textile or pottery. Please submit a printed copy of digital artwork.
- We request that artwork be no larger than 11 x 17. No frames please.
- **Artwork will only be considered if accompanied by the signed Release Form.**
- Both original artwork and Release Form must be received at the District Office by Wednesday, April 8, 2020 at 4:00 p.m.
- Original artwork that is not selected will be returned to the submitting teacher and the winning original artwork will be returned to the artist at the Evening of Appreciation.

HISTORY OF THIS PROJECT

REPresenting Our Schools Art Project began in 2001 as a way to showcase student talent while raising funds for REP programs. The Collections alternate between featuring elementary school artists and secondary school artists. Each year artwork is submitted, judged, and selected for the new Notecard Collection. The selected artwork is then reproduced as notecards and made available for purchase by the general public. The student artists are honored at the Evening of Appreciation in the spring and the new Notecard Collection is released for sale that evening. The featured artwork is framed and displayed at the District Offices for one full year. The California Consortium of Educational Foundations presented REP with its Golden Apple Award for the Art Project in 2001.
