



#### 2020-21: COVID-19 IMPACT TO REP

COVID continued its impact on our fundraising and programs this school year. However, with the hard work of our volunteer Board of Directors, and the continued support of RUSD, we were able to adapt and continue our Mission to enhance educational opportunities for all students to build a strong community. We gave over \$75,000 directly to teachers in the form of checks for \$500 in our new Grants for Teachers program. We held a virtual Turkey Trot that had almost 500 participants. Unfortunately we were not able to fund our T.A.G.S. program for principals this year due to the loss of income from last year. The Evening of Appreciation was also a virtual event and the elementary teachers and classified staff who had been nominated the previous year were finally recognized and winners were announced. Elementary student artists were also celebrated in our renamed ArtsAlive! Student Showcase. The Harlem Wizards game, which had been postponed in April 2020 was once again postponed. Cherish Bohlman, our AAA Academy Director, was able to plan and implement our new Summer Enrichment Camp during the summer break. COVID policies were a challenge, but the camp was a success and the goal is to continue to expand this vital program every year. REP will continue to conquer the obstacles we face in our quest to support our schools, teachers, and students.



## 20.21 Events



The Turkey Trot was held virtually on Thanksgiving Day 2020, with more than 500 participants running to support REP and other local charities.



Again this year, the Harlem Wizards fundraiser is not held in light of the indoor large group restrictions in place due to the COVID-19 virus.





REP honors Elementary students in the first ArtsAlive! Student Showcase. Posters of the winning art work are distributed to school sites and local businesses.

#### **Summer Day Camp**

AAA Academy transitioned from providing a Summer School program to Summer Day Camp program for the summer of 2021. This first year of Summer Camp was a positive experience for the students in Redlands and surrounding communities, with exciting curriculum and hands on experiences in Nature, Olympics, Space, World Cultures, and more. Held at Kingsbury Elementary, 46 students were enrolled over 4 weeks; June 21 through July 16.

AAA's first camp faced the significant challenge of being both a new program and opening during the COVID-19 pandemic.

While registration in this inaugural year of AAA Summer Camp was much lower than hoped for, and did not receive a profit, it provided a beneficial alternative to students and their families. Summer Camp received terrific reviews and campers thoroughly enjoyed the activities, giving AAA Academy a solid foundation for the future.

For the 2021-2022 year, AAA Academy plans to hold Winter, Spring, and Summer Day Camps, serving more grade levels and moving to a full day program. With the experience gained from this camp, AAA will be prepared to provide these camps in the coming years.
