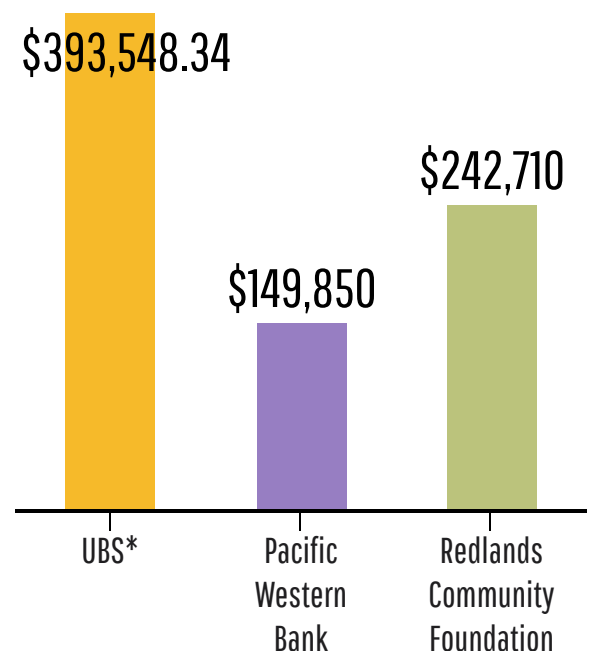

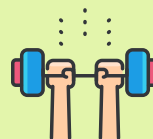

# AAA Academy

## 2021-2022 Day Camps

We held three day camps this year, during Redlands USD school breaks, including Winter, Spring, and Summer Camp. Enrollment for each camp ranged from 41 to 66 kids, with Summer having our highest enrollment. While Winter and Spring Camps were only one week long, Summer Camp ran for 4 weeks. Camps were held on the Kingsbury Elementary campus and were open from 7:30am to 5:30pm to best serve the needs of parents. The overall profit from the camps was \$400. The camp has continued to evolve in order to increase profitability while being a safe and positive place for students to learn, play, and grow.
